Putting a Syllabus in Your Faculty Folder

1. Save the syllabus in a format for others to read. Use a filename that helps you remember what the file is, preferably without spaces. (Mac user needs to add file extension.)
2. Put the document in your syllabi folder by one of the following two methods of navigating to your syllabi folder on the server.
3. Method One to locate the folder
 - a. Open *My Computer*
 - b. Double-click on *www on 'Zipporah (zipporah)'* (W:)
 - c. Open *syllabi* folder and copy (drag and drop) the file to that folder.
4. Method Two to save a copy to the folder.
 - a. Save (Save As) the document.
 - b. Choose *My Computer* as the directory.
 - c. Double-click on *www on 'Zipporah (zipporah)'* (W:)
 - d. Open *syllabi* folder and save the document in that folder.

Linking to the Syllabus in WebDB

1. Navigate to your course description page in WebDB.
2. Click on link (*Update URL*).
3. Enter the path with your information for the URL.
4. See the example below. Substitute your Earlham ID and the name of your file.
5. Click the *Submit URL* button.

Description:	This seminar studies the New Testament book of Hebrews. Rather than try to understand Hebrews as an example of rabbinic midrash, we will focus on Hebrews within its hellenistic Jewish context. We will examine the rhetorical method of synkrisis (comparison) as described in the greek-roman elementary exercises and rhetorical handbook. Its form can be clearly identified throughout Hebrews. Our work will be to study how comparison and exhortation functions in Hebrews, and how that message is relevant for the church today, particularly as it relates to Jewish-Christian relations. Prerequisite: B/BIST 102. 3 semester hours
